
<u>Transdisciplinarity / transformation</u> – role of science and role of law: framing conflicts

Arabian Sea Case study

Work started at the beginning of 2021

- Policy analysis: blue economy and coastal / marine projects, regulation, impacts
- Geophysical and Socio-political mapping relating to conflicts and conflict transformation
- Preliminary contacts with stakeholders: government, artisanal fishers, researchers, environmentalists, petitioners / litigators

Activities initiated for dialogue forum and scoping / research

- 1. Roundtable (Online) with stakeholders on Emerging Risks fo Coastal Zones in India
- 2. Panel Discussion: Future of the *Kolis* in Mumbai
- 3. Initiated a visual methods study of policy impacts on one fishing village
- 4. Initiated a quantitative assessment study to map the impact of coastal and ocean policies on coastal vulnerability (and later conflicts)
